Locate: Locate and uncover New things you discover

Organize: Organize, arrange, get it done! This makes time to have more fun!

Refer: Refer is to mention Information for attention.

Retell: Retell means to repeat or recite; Tell it again and do it right!

Suggest: Recommend, put forth, suggest; Propose ideas that are the best.

Summarize/Paraphrase: Summarize and make it shorter; Just the facts, like a reporter.

Paraphrase: Paraphrase what authors say. Make it easy--say it your way.

Support: Support! Support! Strengthen what you say. Hold up your thoughts in another way.

Synthesize: To synthesize is to become the creator Of a product that is even greater!

Trace: Trace the steps from the start. Follow it, outline it, part by part!

Alliteration: Alliteration allows a sound To actually astound!

Analogy: A is to B as C is to D; I can make an a-nal-o-gy! Argument: Let's argue! Let's argue! But I don't want to fight. I will find the facts to prove that I am right!

Central Idea/Main Idea: What's the big idea you will find next? The author's key point of his text!

Conclusions: If you jump to a conclusion, You may cause some confusion.

Connections: Make a connection; make a link. Use your head and think, think, think!

Connotative Language: Connotative meanings deal with emotion. Word choice can be a powerful potion!

Figurative Language: Simile, metaphor, onomatopoeia, idiom. Figurative language makes learning fun!

Details/Key Details: A detail is a fact That keeps you right on track!

Evidence: E-vi-dence is simply proof. Without it, you may goof!

Illustrations: Illustrations add to the reading--Important info you'll be needing!

Metaphor: A metaphor makes two things the same By giving one the other's name! Simile: Use similes to compare; Be sure like or as is always there.

Point of View: Is it in first, second, or third? How did the author want to be heard?

Rhetoric: You will do what I say If I write in a rhetorical way!

Stanza: A stanza is a room Where poetry can bloom!

Structure: The structure of a text Helps you know what will come next!

Theme: Theme is the message you will find Woven by the author through your mind.

Tone & Mood: Tone is in the author's head. Mood is my feelings as I read!

Classify/Categorize: no jingle

Explicitly: Write explicitly--be very clear. To the rules you will adhere!

Recognize: Recognize is something that I know; I can spot it and make it show!

Recount: Recount, relate, relate. Explain it play by play!
